Participants in the CARPO program complete three (3) training workshops and a home study assignment.

Successful graduates of the program are then recognized as a Certified Arkansas Planning Official (CARPO).

How to Become CARPO Certified:

Certification involves completing four (4) required components, including three (3) workshops and a home study assignment.

Requirements (4)

101 Training \$ 95
Introductory/refresher course

201 Training \$ 95

Advanced topics such as meeting management, parliamentary procedures, communication

301 Training \$ **95**

Advanced topics such as risk management, urban design, neo-traditional design

Home Study \$115

- Reading assignment (book included in registration fee)
- Written essays, open book exam
- Required attendance a Planning Commission meeting at another locality to analyze and report.

Participants have two (2) years to complete the program.
